


Figure 1 Parts of Feedback Collected

Between Aug 2019 and June 2021, input were collected from students, teachers, corporate partners, and alumni (Figure 1).




Figure 2 Programmes across Shivalik College of Engineering

Stage III (Action Taken): The plan of action taken is decided on the basis of action taken report and necessary corrective measures are recommended for the further improvements.




Figure 3 Collection of Feedback




